Capitalize the first word, the last word, and all important words of titles. Do not capitalize a, an, the, and, but, or, and nor unless they are the first or last word.

Do not capitalize prepositions of four or less letters in a title unless they are the first or last word.

Examples: at, by, of, for, from, in, on, with, up, down
